This work session of the City Council of the City of Cedar Hills, having been properly noticed, was called to order at 6:06 p.m. by Mayor Gygi.

Presentation by Representative Kennedy

Representative Kennedy walked the council through the state legislature website using HB 242 (regarding GRAMA requests) as an example. He appreciates communication through short, succinct text messages, Facebook messages. He will set up a time for longer conversations. He felt strongly about the caucus *Count My Vote* compromise bill, he cast a minority vote. He also felt strongly, and is concerned about, Medicaid expansion. There is a proposal for a bridge to overpass I-15 near Thanksgiving Point. There is a master plan for the state development center.

C. Zappala made some suggestions for the state legislative site, including adding the capability to search by sponsor, adding tags to bills and a way to add public comments to bills. He expressed concern about the development of the land south of Lone Peak High School.

Review Agenda Items:

SR-146/Canyon Road

Mayor Gygi recently met with Commissioner Elertson about the possibility of the county owning the road and paying the city to maintain the road. He was non-committal in his response. The city will likely receive money to fix the road this year. If the city does not take ownership, the Mountainland Association of Governments (MAG) funding would not come through.

David Bunker stated that the estimated yearly maintenance on SR-146 would be about \$80,000. The county may receive more money because of the way the road fund formula works, though it would still fall short of the amount it would take to maintain the road on a yearly basis. It would be beneficial to meet with Pleasant Grove to ensure that the two cities are on the same page.

C. Rees stated that it is not a good idea for the city to take ownership. In 10 years, the city will need to figure out how to fund the maintenance. It would be a huge burden on the city.

C. Zappala stated that the city should put pressure on the state or county.
