

CEDAR HILLS - On February 21, 2013 at 7:00pm Cedar Hills will host a townhall meeting focusing on emergency management. Speakers will include members of local LDS stake presidencies, a representative from Lone Peak Public Safety District, and City officials. This is an opportunity to learn how residents and the City will work together in the event of a disaster, what services can be provided by the City or local churches, and how residents should be preparing for emergencies. City officials will also demonstrate how to follow the City's live updates on Facebook and Twitter, which are effective ways to provide mass communication in case of an evacuation or other event that may require continuous information updates. Residents will also be instructed on how to update their information with the City's automated phone system so that the City can send recordings or text messages in the event of an emergency.

"This is an important meeting for every resident of Cedar Hills," stated Mayor Gary Gygi. "Our City is located near a fault line and it is very possible that we could face a major earthquake at some point. Knowing what resources are available in an emergency and how to access those resources is essential."

It is recommended that each family have a representative present at the meeting as there will be important information shared. The meeting will be held at the Community Recreation Center located at 10640 N. Clubhouse Drive.
