

### Mayor's Message

In February, the City Council voted to raise the minimum age to purchase tobacco products in Cedar Hills to 21. In doing so, we join one other Utah city, along with six states and 425 other cities and counties, in enacting laws that raise the minimum legal age to purchase tobacco products to 21.

Our purpose in passing this ordinance is to reduce the number of youth who are taking up smoking, as tobacco use is the number one preventable cause of death in the U.S. Additionally, the number of teens who are using e-cigarettes has risen dramatically, prompting the Surgeon General, Vice Admiral Jerome Adams, to call it a public health epidemic. According to Adams, 1 in 5 high school students and 1 in 20 middle school students currently use e-cigarettes.

In Utah, the number of high school students who use e-cigarettes jumped from 1.5% in 2011 to 11.7% in 2017. A recent editorial written by the CEO of the Huntsman Cancer Institute found that with, "the emergence of new products like e-cigarettes and vape devices, combined with kid

-friendly flavors and advertisements targeting Utah's youths, tobacco use by Utah teens has nearly doubled since 2013."

While the ordinance restricts the sale of tobacco products to anyone under the age of 21, it does not criminalize the use or possession of these products. The aim of this ordinance is to reduce access to those under 21, not to criminalize youth. The effective date of this ordinance will be April 19. Notice has been provided to retailers in our city.

We appreciate the feedback we received from residents as this policy was discussed, and we encourage other cities to go through the process. ### STORM WATER TIPS OF THE MONTH

#### What you do makes a difference!

Most of us pick up after our pets to be a good neighbor and to keep parks and trails clean, but there's another very important reason. Pet waste left on sidewalks or lawns allows harmful bacteria to be washed into the storm drains, polluting lakes and streams. So what can you do to help? Whether at a park, trail, home, or sidewalk dispose of your pet's waste in the trash.



#### Are you adhering to city code?

- Access to gas and water meters, irrigation connections, power boxes, etc. should be visible and accessible at all times. It is prohibited to bury or cover access lids with landscape materials.
- It is unlawful for any person to destroy, deface, injure or interfere with the operation of any part or appurtenance of the water or sewer system (ordinance 3-3-88A, 3-3-1988).
- Fire hydrants should remain unobstructed at all times. Vehicles must park at least 15 feet from a hydrant in any direction, and residents must maintain a 3 foot obstruction clearance directly around a hydrant to ensure accessibility.



#### IMPORTANT: Close PI valve before Spring!

Please make sure that your main pressurized irrigation is in the CLOSED position **before April 15**. This will protect the pipes and sprinkler heads from damage when the high-pressure system is activated.

#### Winter Parking Restrictions until March 31

Street parking is prohibited between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. November 1 through March 31 and when one or more of the following conditions exist:

- When snow is falling,
- When there is a visible amount of snow on the street,
- When the street has not been plowed, and
- During snow/ice removal.



With an accumulation of two inches of snow, plowing is given priority near schools and steep roads. Low-volume roads and park trails are the last to be plowed. City crews are committed to provide safe winter driving conditions.

#### Residential Burn Permit Information

The open-burn policy meets the standards of the State Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), including a statewide requirement to obtain a permit from the local fire authority. ### City Provides Dumpsters for Spring Clean-Up

The city will sponsor its annual “Spring Clean-Up” on **Saturday, April 27**, and **Saturday, May 4**. Large roll-off dumpsters will be available at the following locations:

- 1) Sunset Park – 9814 N Dorchester Drive
- 2) Heritage Park – 4450 W Cedar Hills Drive
- 3) Recreation Center – 10640 N Clubhouse Dr.
- 4) Timpanogos Cove Park – 9508 N Timpanogos Cove
- 5) Morgan Blvd/Sage Vista Drive

**Dumpsters will be available on the two designated Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. until NOON ONLY.** If you are unable to utilize the dumpsters on these two days, the city provides each household with two landfill passes per year. Please review the following guidelines to ensure safety and convenience:

- 1) **Do not place any of these items in the dumpsters:** car tires, car batteries, motor oil, appliances, electronic devices, concrete, construction materials, or liquids of any type.
- 2) Tree limbs should not exceed six inches in diameter and 12 feet in length.
- 3) If the dumpster is full, please take the load to another location to avoid scattering debris or creating difficulty in hauling away the dumpster.

### Keep Weeds, Vegetation under Control

March is a good time to trim back vegetation to free sidewalks and street signs from obstructions. The City Code defines the following conditions as a “nuisance”:

- 1) Weeds on a vacant lot or residential property, along public sidewalks or the outer edge of any public street, or weeds that constitute a fire hazard.
- 2) Accumulation of soil, litter, debris, plant trimmings, or trash visible from the street or an adjoining property.
- 3) Dead, diseased, hazardous, overgrown or uncultivated vegetation obstructing pedestrian or vehicular traffic, or that could harbor rats or other pests.
- 4) The front yard of a lot with a dwelling must be landscaped and maintained with grass not exceeding 6” in height.

### 2019 Municipal Election

A municipal election will be held this year for three city council positions, all four-year terms. The candidate filing period is between **Monday, June 3** and **Friday, June 7**. Interested persons may file for office with the city recorder at the Cedar Hills city office, 10246 N Canyon Road, during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. A \$35 filing fee is required at the time of filing.

### Talk Shop with a Cop

Move Over—A Lifesaving Law

All 50 states have enacted “move over” laws to help protect first responders, tow truck operators, and community members. However, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration found that 71% of Americans are unaware of the law.

Utah’s Move Over Law (41-6a-904) outlines that drivers who are approaching a stationary emergency vehicle, highway maintenance vehicle or towing vehicle that is displaying flashing red, blue, amber, or red and white lights should slow down and provide as much “space as practical,” moving over a lane if it is safe and reasonable.
