This work session meeting of the City Council of the City of Cedar Hills, having been properly noticed, was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Rees

Dax Fossum, the City's representative to North Pointe Solid Waste Special Service District (NPSWSSD), introduced Roger Harper and Craig Hall and turned the time over to them for a presentation.

Mr. Hall explained that the Special Service District was a political subdivision of the State which only had the power to charge fees. He discussed the current state of the landfills, other facilities, the purpose of the NPSWSSD, as well as its history. Important dates and events were also presented.

Mr. Harper discussed the Nuera Landfill, as well as presented pictures of the new facility. They installed a fence to prevent debris from escaping the area. He showed a list of garbage generated by cities in Utah County according to sector: public, commercial, and municipal.

Mr. Hall asked if the Council had heard of the term "iron sword." He explained that this was China's guideline to no longer take recycling that had contaminates. This was threatening the recycling economy. He explained they needed to further educate the residents on how to recycle better because 70% to 80% of recycling was ending back in the landfill. He explained that the City needed to remain a part of the district as they created solutions. It was important they had as many members as possible to pool their resources. He then explained that there was a company from Germany that could handle all the City's waste, and suggested the Council listen and consider their offer. Lastly, Mr. Hall explained that e-waste should not be placed in landfills. He said there were no resources allocated to prevent them from polluting landfills. An e-waste trust fund or fee was suggested as a potential solution to this issue.

C. Andersen asked about paint disposal. Mr. Harper explained that with certain paints once it was solidified it could be put in a garbage can and taken to the dump.

C. Geddes asked when a vote for renewal would take place. Mr. Harper explained that the interlocal agreement would go through 2019 with an automatic renewal. Mr. Hall stated they needed a long-term relationship in order to be the most effective.

Cedar Canyon Subdivision

Mr. Goodwin explained that they settled on the Cedar Canyon agreement in July. He said there was an update on the agreement, and they were asking for administrative consent. He suggested they discuss this item by the next Council meeting.

This meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m. on a motion by C. Andersen, seconded by C. Ellsworth, and unanimously approved.
