
Mayor's Message

When I logged into my email account today, I was heart-broken to read that a student at a nearby high school committed suicide. This is the 6th student in the Alpine School District lost to suicide in 2019. There have also been numerous reported suicide attempts in our city as well as in our neighboring cities. Because we live in a small and safe community, we often don't realize that issues such as these exist, yet the data shows that Utah's suicide rate has dramatically increased over the past 20 years. Unfortunately, our city and schools have not been immune.

As such, I want to share a few resources to assist those that are struggling, and encourage an ongoing dialogue with our families, friends, neighbors, and colleagues.

- Download the free SafeUT app on your smartphone. Users can chat with a crisis counselor via phone or text. Counselors provide a non-judgmental space to talk about your crisis and help direct you to resources.
- Add the Suicide Prevention Lifeline to your contacts: (800) 273-8255. Counselors are available 24/7 to help.

- Take a QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer) training in person or online. This course provides training on suicide warning signs and information on how to talk to those who are considering suicide. Visit qprinstitute.com for training information.
- If you are worried that someone you know is suicidal, call 911 or take them to a hospital so they can receive the help they need.
- Don't be afraid to talk about suicide with those you love. It can be a tough conversation, but one that could save a life.

STORM WATER TIPS OF THE MONTH

Decrease Runoff and Increase Infiltration

Homeowners can significantly reduce the storm water load that leaves their property, improving surface water quality and helping to recharge groundwater reserves. What can I do? Direct precipitation runoff to permeable areas to allow infiltration and ground water recharge. When possible, redirect downspouts away from the house toward grassy areas or other areas with high permeability. By making small changes at the local level, water quality in the watershed can be greatly improved.

Residential Burn Permit Information

The State Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) requires a permit from the Lone Peak Fire District. The application process begins at the DEQ's website: deq.utah.gov. More detailed information is available on the Cedar Hills website under Sanitation.

Parking for Boats and Trailers

A friendly reminder not to use public streets for long-term parking of cars, trucks, trailers (for work or play), RV's, boats, campers, basketball standards, etc. According to city ordinances, such items cannot remain on the street for more than 48 hours. Keep all of the above-mentioned items on hard surfaces on your property.



Street Light Out or Flickering?

Please let the city's public works department know if you are aware of any street lights that need to be serviced.

Installing a Fence, Shed, or Retaining Wall?

Prior to installation, please visit the city's website or call the city office for important information. The website provides a pdf to download and instructions for submitting the required installation permit. Call Blue Stakes before you dig; it's the law! Dial 811 to reach Blue Stakes.

Landscape Watering Restrictions Set

The city continues with outdoor watering conservation measures for all residential water users. Residents with odd-ending house numbers will water **Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays**. Residents with even-ending house numbers will water **Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays**. Spot watering with a hose is allowed on Sundays for everyone. Restrictions are enforced with a warning for the first violation, a \$50 fine for the second violation, and a \$200 fine for the third and subsequent violations. The policy is in effect from April 15 to October 15. Commercial, church, park, and golf properties may be on different schedules, including daytime watering, to offset water demand.

As we begin another watering season, we encourage everyone to implement water conservation practices. Visit conservewater.utah.gov for info about water-wise plants and other methods of conserving water. Water is not a renewable resource, so we need to use it wisely!

The city office will be closed on Memorial Day, May 27. There will be a one-day delay in garbage pickup service the week of May 27.

Annual Service Day Set for May 18

Each year, the Beautification Committee provides opportunities to participate in service projects in our neighborhoods, parks, and other areas. This year's project will be on **Saturday, May 18**. Interested persons may file for office with the city recorder at the Cedar Hills city office, 10246 N Canyon Road, during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. A \$35 filing fee is required.
