
Fireworks & Fire Restrictions

With the fireworks season upon us, the city declares its support for the American Fork Fire Department to limit fire risk in our community by adopting a resolution (City Code 5-2-3A4), which outlines these restrictions:

Fireworks: All aerial and nonstationary fireworks, i.e. ground flower types, are prohibited inside and within 200 feet of the highlighted areas of the restrictions map and within 200 feet of any undeveloped lot. The map can be viewed at cedarhills.org/fires2019.

ALL fireworks and aerials are prohibited in city parks, the golf course, and all other city owned properties.

Open Fires: All open fires east of Canyon Road within city limits are prohibited, unless a screen is used. Cedar Hills officials and staff wish all residents a fun and safe summer. Please use caution and good judgement when using fireworks or building open fires.

Mayor's Message

In the summer of 2017, the city gave notice to Lone Peak Public Safety District of our intent to leave the District and sent out requests for public safety proposals. We received proposals from three agencies that offered both fire and police services, and in September 2018 the Council made the decision to contract with American Fork City for both police and fire services. There were three main factors that led to this decision: 1) Having police and fire responding from the same agency provides a better level of service as the two departments have more opportunities to collaborate and train together when they work for the same agency, 2) The proposal received from American Fork was significantly less than the other two but provided the same level of service, and 3) Our contract with American Fork has a set annual increase, so forecasting and planning for future public safety expenses is much easier. Our contract with Lone Peak Public Safety ends on June 30th, and American Fork Fire will be the agency providing fire and EMS services to our city effective July 1st, 2019.

I want to express our appreciation for the men and women who work for Lone Peak Public Safety. Our city has been well served by their fire and EMS teams for many years. Not only did they provide these services with professionalism and expertise, but they also participated in many community events such as Family Festival and our annual city breakfast. I am grateful to each of them for their commitment and their service.

Using City Parks

Many people have begun using the city's beautiful parks and trails. Please be aware that there are rules established for usage to ensure safety and enjoyment for everyone, including those who live near the parks.



- Park curfew is 11:00 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Amplified sound has restrictions.
- Pets are to be on a leash, and owners should dispose of pet waste properly.

Pressurized Irrigation Reminder:

As we approach the hottest period of the season, there is a greater chance for moss and debris to build up on your pressurized irrigation filter. It is recommended to clean your pressurized irrigation filter monthly. For information on how to clean your individual filter, contact the manufacturer or a local plumbing store.

For now, American Fork Fire will utilize our fire station and will keep it fully staffed to respond to our area. At some point, American Fork will be building a new fire station near our border on North County Blvd and will move there, though there is no set timeframe for this. While we expect that response times to our city from that new facility will continue to be within industry standards, American Fork is willing to amend our agreement to provide some staffing at our current station if we determine that is needed.

Our goal is to continue to provide high-quality service while also planning for our future needs with the understanding that our city will not be experiencing much new growth. We look forward to a long partnership with American Fork Police and Fire and appreciate their leadership and teams for contributing to our community.

Pool/Spa Maintenance

When emptying a pool or spa, never discharge pool or spa water to a street or storm drain. Let chlorine dissipate for a few days, and then recycle/reuse it by draining it gradually onto a landscaped area. Do not use copper-based algacides unless absolutely necessary. Control algae with chlorine or other alternatives. Copper is an especially strong herbicide and doesn't degrade to less toxic forms quickly.

What is hazardous waste?

These are household items you should **NOT** be throwing away in the regular garbage can.

- Glass/Metal
- Electronics & Appliances
- Medications/Needles
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Car batteries/Oil
- Paint/Paint thinner

Landscape Watering Restrictions

The city continues with outdoor watering conservation measures for all residential water users. Residents with odd-ending house numbers will water **Monday, Wednesday, and Friday**. Residents with even-ending house numbers will water **Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday**. Spot watering with a hose is allowed on Sundays for everyone. Restrictions are enforced with a warning for the first violation, a \$50 fine for the second violation, and a \$200 fine for the third and subsequent violations. The policy is in effect from April 15 to October 15. Commercial, church, park, and golf properties may be on different schedules, including daytime watering, to offset water demand.



Parking for Boats and Trailers

A friendly reminder NOT to use public streets for long-term parking of cars, trucks, trailers (for work or play), RV's, boats, campers, basketball standards, etc.

According to city ordinances, such items cannot remain on the street for more than 48 hours. Keep all of the above-mentioned items on hard surfaces on your property.

Public Safety Presentations and Firehouse Tours, Elementary Fire Safety Programs, Youth FireSetter Prevention and Intervention Program, CPR/First Aid Classes, Car Seat Installation and Donation Programs, Smoke Detector Donation Programs, Business Inspections, Fire Hydrant Inspections.

The department motto of our organization is "ALWAYS READY", and when called upon we will respond in a rapid, professional, compassionate manner. The members of AFFR are proud to serve the citizens of Cedar Hills.
