7. Mayor and Council

C. Andersen stated that she and C. Miller attended the Utah Leadership session on September 5th, there were presentations on transportation and growth, and also that she attended the Waste Water Treatment Plant (TSSD) tour today.

Mayor Rees commented that the Timpanogos Special Service District tour was interesting. She stated that she attended the *Prepare 60* water school last week which focused on water conservation efforts. She noted that on September 28th the Summit Academy School will be hosting a health and wellness fair, and she encouraged council and staff to attend.

8. Review/Action on a Resolution Cancelling the November 5, 2019 Municipal General Election

Mr. Goodwin explained that there were three City Council positions open for election and only three candidates applied. Utah State Code 20A-1-206 states that a municipal legislative body may cancel a local election if each municipal candidate is unopposed, and there is no proposition to appear on the ballot. We waited until the write-in candidate deadline (September 3) had passed, and did not receive any write-in candidates so we are proposing to the Council that they pass a resolution to cancel the municipal general election.

C. Geddes asked if there was any reason why the names of the candidates were not listed on the resolution.

Mr. Goodwin stated that is was not a requirement for the resolution. City Recorder Mulvey indicated that she would add the names of the candidates declared elected to office in the official legal notices to be published.
