

New information regarding our city services starting May 11th.

- Passports** Passport services are available by **appointment only**. To schedule an appointment, please email frontdesk@cedarhills.org.
- Golf** The golf course is open and has implemented the required sanitizing and social distancing measures.
- Recreation** All recreation team sports are cancelled while in the moderate-risk phase. Some recreation classes and programs may be available when proper safety guidelines can be followed.
- Vista Room** All private events in the Vista Room must adhere to the required sanitizing and social distancing guidelines and are limited to gatherings of no more than 20 people during the moderate-risk phase.
- Water** There is no risk to our water systems and no changes to services.
- Garbage** Garbage and recycling services will continue as scheduled.
- Parks/Trails** Parks and trails will remain open, but we encourage residents to follow state guidelines. This includes not allowing children on playground equipment and keeping a distance of 6 feet from other household groups. While our restrooms are cleaned routinely, we do not have a set sanitizing schedule for restrooms and our playground equipment and other amenities such as pavilions are not sanitized. No reservations for parks or park amenities will be available during the moderate risk phase.
- Public Safety** All public tours of public safety buildings are cancelled. Fingerprinting is now available at the American Fork Police Station. Contact AFPD for fingerprinting availability, to receive copies of police reports, or other administrative services on the non-emergency line 801-763-3020.
- Public Meetings** All public city meetings will be held electronically through the end of June. The City will follow all state directives on holding public meetings going forward.
- Family Festival** The only guaranteed event that we will be able to provide this year is the fireworks show that will take place the same date and time as previously scheduled, **Saturday, June 6th at 10:00 p.m.**
- Dump Passes** The City provides each household two landfill passes per year. Send an email with your name and address to frontdesk@cedarhills.org and they will be mailed to you.

City offices will be open Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 9am-3pm. The lobby will be limited to one scheduled appointment at a time. General guidelines for individuals:

Children:

- Do not attend school outside the home
- Do not arrange or participate in in-person playdates or similar activities
- Do not allow children on public playgrounds
- Soft closure of schools; schools may send home food

Utah's Moderate Risk Phase
What does it mean and what can you do?

Moving to orange
 Utah's social distancing efforts to slow the spread of COVID-19 have been working. Forward progress won't be instant like flipping a switch. It'll be more like gradually moving a dial.
 A color-coded health guidance system has been developed by the State of Utah to guide health measurement system which can be different by each region, county, city, or community.
In every color, high-risk individuals operate under specific instructions issued by the Utah Department of Health.

General guidelines for businesses:

High-Risk Individuals:

- Face coverings worn at all times in public settings
- Limit travel to only essential travel; if telework is not possible, limit travel to work-related travel only
- Limit visiting friends or family without urgent need
- Limit physical interactions with other high-risk individuals, except for members of your household or residence
- Limit attending gatherings of any number of people outside your household or residence
- Do not visit hospitals, nursing homes, or other residential care facilities

Mayor's Message

For the 2019-2020 school year, Mrs. Stephens' third grade class at Cedar Ridge Elementary worked on researching ways to help the monarch butterfly after learning that their numbers are declining across the country. As part of their efforts to help save monarchs from becoming an endangered species, they came to the city and asked for help identifying locations where milkweed could be planted and asking for a resolution from the city supporting their efforts. In December, the City Council unanimously approved a resolution of support and provided a map of native city-owned land where milkweed could be planted. Through the efforts of Mrs. Stephens' class, on March 13th Cedar Hills was recognized as the



first "Monarch City USA" in Utah. I want to thank these students for their hard work and efforts. I was impressed by their dedication to this project, especially when the entire class came to a City Council meeting to share their insights and make their request. I encourage residents

STORM WATER TIP OF THE MONTH

Stormwater Protection

Please do not place any dirt, debris, material, tracked mud, or spills in Public Street or Sidewalk without immediately cleaning up. Violators will need to clean the street within 12 hours or will be liable to the city for the costs of doing so.

Installing a Fence, Shed, or Retaining Wall?

Prior to installation, please visit the city's website or call the city office for important information. The website provides a download and instructions for submitting the required installation permit. Call Blue Stakes before you dig; it's the law! Dial 811 to reach Blue Stakes.

Streets are Not for Long Term Parking

A friendly reminder not to use public streets for long-term parking of vehicles, trailers (work or play), RV's, boats, campers, basketball standards, etc. According to city ordinances, such items cannot remain on the street for more than 48 hours. Keep all of the above-mentioned items on hard surfaces on your property.

Door-to-Door Solicitors

Help keep our neighborhoods safe. Ask solicitors to show a city-issued photo badge or instruct them to obtain a license from the city. Report violations or nuisances to police dispatch 24/7 at 801-794-3970.



Open Burn Permit

Permits may be issued between **March 30 and May 30** and between **September 15 and October 30**. Burn permits are required and should be kept on site as the burn is conducted. For more information on Open Burn permits, visit www.cedarhills.org - under sanitation.

Landscape Watering Restrictions

The city continues outdoor watering conservation measures for all residential water users. Residents with odd-ending house numbers will water **Monday, Wednesday, and Friday**. Residents with even-ending house numbers will water **Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday**.

Spot watering with a hose is allowed on Sundays..

Restrictions are enforced with a warning for the first violation, a \$50 fine for the second violation, and a \$200 fine for the third and sub-sequent violations.

Commercial, church, park, and golf properties may be on different schedules, including daytime watering, to offset water demand. By installing and registering an approved Smart Irrigation Controller with the city, gives an alternative watering option. In order to register a Smart Irrigation Controller, email a photo of an approved installed controller with identifying information such as: make, model, and serial number.
