STORM WATER TIP OF THE MONTH

We Can Make a Difference!

Storm drains may lead straight to rivers, lakes, and streams. When contaminants enter storm drains, they can pollute our water resources. Storm water runoff is a major source of surface water pollution. Runoff can pick up contaminants on the ground, including sediment, oil, gas, fertilizer, pet waste, grass clippings, car wash water, etc. By making some simple changes, you can help prevent polluted runoff:

- Fix auto leaks promptly
- Properly dispose of used motor oil
- Do not fertilize before it rains
- Do not top off when you fill up
- Put trash in its place
- Never dump anything down a storm drain!

Landscape Water Restrictions

The City of Cedar Hills encourages residential properties to follow water conservation methods and water restriction schedules. Smart Irrigation Controllers are now available to assist residents with an alternate watering option. For more information on Smart Irrigation Controllers or outdoor water restriction schedules; please visit the city's website and look for the Cedar Hills Smart Irrigation Controller Policy. We appreciate the continued efforts of residents in helping to conserve our precious water resources.

Residents watering days are as follows;

Odd numbered homes: Monday, Wednesday, Friday.
Even numbered homes: Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday.



Park Hours

As warmer months approach, many people will be using the City's beautiful parks and trails. Please be aware that there are rules established for usage to ensure safety and enjoyment for those in the park and those who live near the parks.

1. Parks are closed **11:00 pm to 5:00 am** from Memorial Day to Labor Day. If you are in the park after-hours, the police will be notified, and you may be subject to legal action.
2. **Pets are to be on a leash** and owners should dispose of waste properly.
3. Children should be supervised at all time.
4. Respect the privacy of the landowners who are adjacent to the parks and trails and do not disturb the landscaping.
5. **Motor vehicles are not allowed** in parks or on trails.
6. Smoking and alcoholic beverages are prohibited.

Sidewalk Safety

The City of Cedar Hills asks that you be courteous to fellow residents by keeping your sidewalks clear for pedestrians. This would include bushes and overhanging trees. Summer is a great time to get out and walk around and we want to make sure it's as enjoyable as possible for everyone.

Planning Commission Vacancy

Parking for Boats and Trailers


A friendly reminder not to use public streets for long-term parking of cars, trucks, trailers (for work or play), RV's, boats, campers, basketball standards, etc. According to city ordinances, such items cannot remain on the street for more than 48 hours. Keep all of the above-mentioned items on hard surfaces on your property.



Fireworks & Fire Restrictions

Fireworks: All aerial and nonstationary fireworks, i.e. ground flower types, are prohibited inside and within 200 feet of the highlighted areas of the restrictions map and within 200 feet of any undeveloped lot. The map can be viewed at cedarhills.org/fires2019. Additionally, ALL fireworks and aeri- als are prohibited in city parks, the golf course, and all other city-owned properties.

Open Fires: All open fires east of Canyon Road within city limits are prohibited, unless a screen is used. Cedar Hills officials and staff wish all residents a fun and safe summer. Please use caution and good judgement when using fireworks or building open fires.



TALK SHOP WITH A COP



We would like to take the time to express our appreciation to everyone who took the time to reach out to the department during the National Police Week Event and those members of the community that support us throughout the year. In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation designating May 15th as Peace Officer Memorial Day and the week surrounding that date as Police Week. According to the FBI statistics, there were 89 police officers killed in the line of duty in 2019. This includes Officer Joseph Shinnars of the Provo Police Department, who was killed by gunfire on January 5, 2019. Officer Shinnars left behind a wife and a son that he was never able to meet in this life. While it did not occur in 2019, Joseph D. Adams is another local officer from the Lehi Police Department who was killed by gunfire on August 4, 2001. Officers Adams had volunteered to help with the American Fork Steel Days Celebration just a few weeks before his death. These events and statistics help remind us that our freedoms and safety are not free and that some people pay a high price to defend and protect them.

As we celebrate Memorial Day and Police Week, I would encourage everyone to consider the sacrifices that have been made by police officers, firefighters and members of the military to help ensure our freedoms and to improve the quality of life we enjoy in the United States. We are grateful for their service. We hope to continue to work together with the community to help make the future even brighter. These events also help highlight that we should appreciate those around us and let them know of our appreciation because life can change in an instant.
